Lake Linden-Hubbell Elementary School's 5th & 6th grade classes are planning, designing, and building an interpretive disc (frisbee) golf course on a restored superfund site adjacent to Torch Lake and the Lake Linden Village Park as part of their Lake Superior Stewardship Initiative project. The students are involved in all aspects of the project, and are enthusiastic about providing their community with both recreational and educational opportunities, as well as potentially stimulating the local economy by bringing more people to Lake Linden.

The interpretive disc golf course will have 9 "holes" with signs posted at each tee describing historical, ecological, and Great Lakes stewardship topics. Those using the course will benefit from participating in a free, healthy, and educational activity in the outdoors. The course will provide a convenient and fun way for families to enjoy active time together outdoors.




